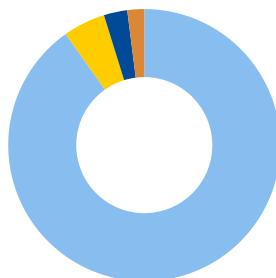

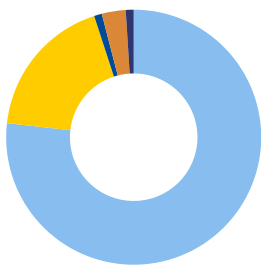

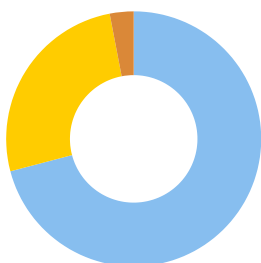
MISSION FUNDING
